LOCUM ARRESTED FOR PRACTISING ILLEGALLY

13 May 2022

For immediate release

Pretoria – The Health Professions Council of South Africa (HPCSA) continues to execute its mandate of eradicating unregistered practitioners in the healthcare sector.

The Inspectorate Office conducted an inspection following a tip-off at the practice of Dr Mokotjo in Rustenburg. During the inspection, Mr Nkhaketla Mandela (a Lesotho citizen) was found practising as a locum (Dental Therapist) whilst not registered with Council. Mr Mandela was employed by Dr Mokotjo, (a registered Dentist) since February 2022. He was arrested and detained at the Rustenburg South African Police Service for being in contravention of sections 17(1), 33,34, and 39 of the Health Professions Act, 56 of 1974. Dr Mokotjo will be reported to the respective Professional Board for misconduct.

The HPCSA's mandate is to protect the public and guide the professions through ensuring enforcement and compliance from the practitioners in line with the provisions of the Health Professions Act. The HPCSA cautions practitioners on the dangers of employing locum doctors who are not registered with Council as this poses a risk on the lives of the community.
