

HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT 56 OF 1974

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF STUDENTS IN ORAL HYGIENE

Published under Government Notice R1038 in *Government Gazette* 11326 of 3 June 1988.

The Minister of National Health and Population Development has, in terms of [section 61](#) (1) (1) of the Medical, Dental and Supplementary Health Service Professions Act, 1974 (Act 56 of 1974), on the recommendation of the South African Medical and Dental Council, made the regulations set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

1. In these regulations “**the Act**” shall mean the Medical, Dental and Supplementary Health Service Professions Act, 1974 (Act 56 of 1974), and any expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall bear that meaning, and, unless the context otherwise indicates -

“**section**” shall mean a section of the Act.

2. A student in oral hygiene at a university in the Republic offering a qualification in oral hygiene, which qualification is recognised by the council under the provisions of the Act, shall submit to the registrar in accordance with the provisions of regulation 3 an application for registration as a student in oral hygiene on a form obtainable for the registrar -
 - (a) in the case of a student enrolled at such university for a first year of study in oral hygiene, within two months of such enrolment; or
 - (b) in the case of a student who has been exempted from the first year of study, within two months of the commencement of his second year of study in oral hygiene; or
 - (c) in the case of a student who on the date of publication of these regulations has already commenced attendance of courses at a university, within two months of the date of publication of these regulations.
