

# HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT 56 OF 1974

## REGULATIONS RELATING TO QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION OF ASSISTANT CLINICAL TECHNOLOGISTS AND REGISTRATION OF PERSONS QUALIFIED OUTSIDE THE REPUBLIC

Published under Government Notice R237 in *Government Gazette* 22133 of 16 March 2001.

The Minister of Health has, in consultation with the Health Professions Council of South Africa, in terms of [section 61](#) (1), read with [sections 24](#) and [25](#) of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974), made the regulations in the Schedule.

### SCHEDULE

#### Definitions

1. In this Schedule any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall bear such meaning and, unless the context otherwise indicates-

“**professional board**” means the Professional Board for Radiography and Clinical Technology established in terms of [section 15](#) (1) of the Act, as published by Government Notice No. R. 75 of 16 January 1998; and

“**the Act**” means the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974).

2. The qualifications required for registration as an assistant clinical technologist in terms of the Act shall be specified below:

3. Any person holding a qualification referred to in regulation 2 shall have passed a competency-based test conducted by the council.
4. In the case of an application for registration that is based on a qualification that has not yet been approved by the council, the applicant shall furnish the council with authoritative information on the training required for such qualification and, if the standard of such training is considered satisfactory by the council, such qualification may be approved.
